

Employment situation and employment trends

Tight yet dynamic labour market

- · 2-3% unemployment (2022 World Bank) Every expat residing in the UAE is either employed or sponsored by a family member
- · Growth of workforce of 10.53% in the past Year (Ministry of Human Resources and Emiratisation Jan. 2024)
- · Some level of saturation with a dense workforce and companies more inclined to hire locally GCC work experience is more relevant than ever (Saudi being a key market)

What to bet on

- · Growth in non-oil economy: IT/Tech, Banking/Finance/Fintech, Real Estate/Construction, Tourism/Hospitality
- · New-Age Sectors: Digital Economy, Al, Metaverse
- · Sales & Marketing roles
- · Data Science, Digital, E-Commerce related roles

Trends

- · Trade Licenses/Sole proprietorship, Freelance Visas
- · New progressive labor laws (2022-2023): Savings Scheme, Unemployment Insurance Scheme, Fixed-Term Employment Contracts...
- · Emiratisation to encourage emiratis to consider careers in the private sector

Employment situation and employment trends

International workforce

- · End of 2021: 9,991,083 residents with roughly 9M expatriates permanently residing in the UAE
- · Population by Emirate: Dubai (3.3M) & Abu Dhabi (1.45M)
- · 200 Nationalities in the UAE a diversity of cultures at work and in day to day life (cuisine, arts, etc.)

The **economy of the UAE** has shown resilience - non-oil sector and oil production saw a decline in late 2023 but are expected to bounce back (non-oil represents 70% of the total GDP)

Geographic Breakdown / Sectors:

- · Dubai: Retail, F&B/Hospitality, Financial Services, ICT, Real Estate
- · Abu Dhabi: Oil & Gas, Public/Government, Tourism
- · Fujairah/Ajman/Sharjah/Umm Al Quwain/Ras Al Khaimah: Tourism, Industry/Mining

Upon arrival (or prior), network & leverage the local French community

- · Emlyon alumni
- · Join dedicated groups on Linkedin to help you identify French expats in your industry: JOGEA (Joint Grandes Ecoles Alumni UAE), UAE French connection
- · French corporates (also looking for a VIE is a good way to start your career in the UAE)

Spend some time on site to meet people in your industry, attend events and start building your local network

· If you are looking for a position in Fintech/Financial Services for example, attend DIFC Connect events, reach out to the team and introduce yourself as well as your objectives

How's the life there?

· Choose your lifestyle - run away from the clichés and go for the set up that suits you best. Arabic is not mandatory at all, but it is always a plus

General

- Life in UAE
- Be comfortable about the weather, the cosmopolitan nature of the workforce, and the pace of work

Looking for a Job

- > English mastery is important to communicate clearly and understand various dialects
- >While there are many job opportunities, the market is fairly saturated due to post-covid inflow of candidates, so the key is to differentiate oneself
- Differentiation comes by having a professional Linkedin profile, attending events/conferences, engaging with professionals in target industries, and connecting with headhunters to market yourself well and not assume because if you have a good degree you'd be competitive
- Build a network of referrals in the UAE and outside UAE



Do's & Don'ts

Do's and don'ts

Linda Souak

- · Do: Reach out to people directly to express interest (try to get introductions)
- · Don't: ONLY apply online. For each open role, there are thousands of applicants

Lee Hobeika

- · Do: Get acquainted with local/regional companies in your industries
- · Don't: Set your compensation expectations too high

Nayim Khemais

- · Do: Spend time in the UAE to connect on the ground with companies
- Don't: Don't get discouraged if no reply or apply only to few offers
