01 Your campus

New address




The campus has two entrances:

- The main entrance at avenue Jean Jaurès
- Allée de Fontenay via a pedestrian street behind avenue Jean Jaurès

All entrances are secure. You will need to scan your badge at access control to enter.

You can use an indoor walkway below the through street to cross from one end of the campus to the other:



Campus hours

The campus is open Monday-Saturday 7am to 10pm.

The public through street is also accessible Monday-Saturday 7am to 10pm.

Getting to campus

Access to the reduced mobility parking lot: The campus has four parking spaces for people with reduced mobility (PRM) off of rue Simone Iff (subject to prior authorization).

Elevator access:

Badge-access elevators are indicated on signs for all staff and continuing education teachers and participants.


Students in the core programs will require prior authorization to use the elevators.

If I come by bicycle or Vélov'




The campus is surrounded by bicycle paths.
Plan your route on the <u>Geovelo</u> or <u>Les voies lyonnaises</u> app.
Use the area Vélov' docking stations or park at the campus bike racks:

- 380 spaces at three secure badge-access bike shelters are available for **emlyon** students and staff:
 - One at rue Simone Iff for students
 - Two at Allée Fontenay: one for students and one for emly on staff and Adjunct Faculty They can accommodate both push bikes and electric bikes.
- There are many bike racks located in front of the campus entrance and on the street for visitors.

If I have a cargo or longtail, scooter or motorized two-wheeler

Special cargo and longtail bicycles and scooters must be parked on the through street at the designated racks.

Motorized two-wheelers must be parked in front of the campus in dedicated public spaces.







• You must dismount from all vehicles (bicycles, scooters, etc.) as soon as you enter the school premises, including the front courtyard and the through street.

- Electric bikes and scooters can be recharged at the garden-level charging station in Building C. Enter through the main atrium behind the dining hall.

 For fire safety reasons, this is the only charging station.
 - A complete bike repair kit (pump, toolbox, tire patches) is available at the Security Desk.

Entering the campus


The type of badge you are given depends on your profile:

A badge is required to enter the campus and other areas.

There are three types of badges:

- A physical name badge like the one used at Ecully, Paris and Saint-Etienne
- A digital name badge on your cell phone
- A QR Code issued emlyon staff

Badges depend on your profile:



Please find below the procedures for dematerialized badges and QR codes*:



I am a long-term Continuing Education participant, a student or an on-site provider:

• I generate my own dematerialized bagde via this procedure.



I am a short-term Continuing Education participant or an incubator participant:

• I receive my dematerialized badge in my inbox, generated by my **emlyon** advisor and sent by ARDACCESS.



I am a visitor, a service provider hosted off-site, an incubator participant, un jury member or an applicant:

• I receive my QR Code* in my inbox, in an e-mail sent by nodocontact@ard.fr.



I am an alumni:

- I request a QR code* via my alumni platform.
- I receive my QR code* in my emlyon mailbox, in an email sent by nocontact@ard.fr.

*Each QR code generated is valib for 1 day.



What should I do if my physical badge is lost or stolen?


- If I am a student in an initial training program, I contact the Student Services Center.
- If I am an Continuing Education participant, I contact my program coordinator.



02 The spaces

The campus has four separate three-story buildings (A, B, C, D) with similar layouts and functions.

Garden level:



Ground floor:



The upper floors house classrooms, and teaching and academic resources.



The Maker's lab

- The maker's lab is located on the garden level and the ground floor across from the dining hall at the main atrium
- Lit opens on August 26th and can be accessed Monday and Wednesday 1pm-8pm, and Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday 9am-6pm
 - a workshop space for workshops, bootcamps, trainings, classes, etc.
 - a space for devices and software
 - online learning resources

The Library

- Ground floor of Building B.
- Open to the public starting on June 12th (reduced hours). After June 17th: Monday-Friday, 8:30am-8pm and Saturday 10am-4pm.
 - group and individual workspaces (bookable on Affluences)
 - a training space
 - a self-service checkout machine for borrowing and returning books
 - a lock box in Building D for borrowing and returning documents without having to go to the library

The Health and Wellbeing Center

- Ground floor of Building D
- Opens on July 15th


Monday-Friday 9am-5pm in person and remote

03 Food Services

On campus

"Les Comptoirs"

Opens on August 19*

- © Garden level of Building C
- Open to students and emlyon staff. This space is open all day during campus hours. Food is served 11:15am-2:30pm

It has four stations offering different types of food Dishes are prepared and served on-site Eating areas include a space with tables inside the cafeteria, the main atrium, along the indoor walkway, and outdoor spaces

Opens on August 19th*


- O At the Jean Jaurès entrance before the security gates

- The campus food options cater to every type of diet.
- They use local, seasonal ingredients bought directly from producers.
- You can use the <u>Too Good To Go</u> app on campus to save low-cost meals from going to waste. Pick up bags at the takeout space.
- Lunch should be eaten in the dining areas provided: food service facilities, break rooms on the staff floors, the main atrium and the outdoors spaces.
- Please note that eating is not permitted in classrooms, open spaces and the auditorium.



Bring your own food

You can eat in the main atrium (the campus's large central hall), the emlyon staff lounges, and the common areas. Microwaves will be provided in these spaces.

Except for takeout service, only people who have passed through the security gates can access the dining facilities.



Have a coffee in the staff lounges

The campus follows the school's no-cup policy.

Remember to bring your own mug or reusable cup. Coffee service is available at:

- The takeout counter
- Comptoir Jaurès on the garden level
- There are several coffee machines on campus and in the common areas

Payment is accepted by card, cash, Google Pay and Apple Pay.



Get a reusable cup

If you forget your mug, you can purchase a reusable cup for ≤ 2 in the takeout area at the campus entrance, and Comptoir Jaurès during business hours.

There are no return deposits: your reusable cup belongs to you.

All proceeds are donated to the emlyon Foundation to fund its community projects.

06 Guidelines and policies for a better community

Safety guidelines for you and people around you

- When it's rainy and cold, be careful on patios, terraces and walkways that may be slippery
- 2. Hold the handrail on the stairs
- 3. Do not sit on or lean over guardrails on walkways and terraces
- 4. Do not use a step ladder or stool to work at heights; only rolling platform ladders and lightweight rolling platform ladders are permitted
- 5. Do not enter electrical and technical facilities unless authorized
- 6. Do not block vents
- 7. Do not lend anyone your badge or try to enter at the same time
- 8. Do not leave your personal belongings unattended
- 9. If you see a suspicious package or bag, quickly inform Security at the two main entrances to the campus

Rules for common areas

It is important to implement a code of conduct for common areas to foster a communal atmosphere that is inclusive, respectful, and conducive to learning.


Below are the main established principles, which will be updated as we settle in.

- Do not bring in your personal household appliances (kettle, coffee machine, heater, etc.) or power strips
- Close the windows when you leave your workstation
- Smoke in designated areas
- Do not bring your scooter or bike into the campus
- Do not eat in areas not designed for this purpose (including classrooms and offices)
- Pets are not allowed, except for guide dogs and therapy dogs
- Silence is golden on the upper floors, meeting rooms and workspaces
